My serious involvement in Science CBLC started since December 1998 when I evaluated two certified IT courses proposed by students, and in July 1999 I took over the advisory task from the previous Sub-Dean A/Prof Ling San. Nonetheless, CBLC was not alien to me for the past ten years because many of my students had used the computer facility to complete their programming assignments. It was common to see the Centre packed with students trying out new ideas for bonus, or trying hard to solve the problems in their programs especially when the assignment dateline was close.

The 11th and 12th Management Committees and their members have impressed me in many aspects. First, I want to commend their initiative and effort to conduct two Comprehensive and Certified Courses on Web Design and Multimedia respectively. With the capability and enthusiasm of the current management committee and members, I have full confidence that they will deliver a job very well done again.

They have either set up their own company that provides web services or become a free-lance IT consultant. In fact I was not surprised when I met them in the last convocation. The CBLC has been a place for students to learn from peers, to harness their IT capabilities, to explore and experiment new ideas, and also to nurture their technopreneurship. Students are involved in business when they liaise with the commercial and industrial partners for the IT-Month project, when they negotiate for sponsorships, when they bargain for discounts, etc. As such, I want to invite all of you to participate in these activities and I am sure your involvement will be a valuable experience.
